Jesus made it! He made it through the trial in the desert, through Calvary, and now reigns in heaven. We who are human will also make it if we believe and persevere.

Perseverance causes joy for we too walk the Calvary Road with Jesus.

Upon Calvary, Jesus died, but we who persevere in carrying our cross, will die too, only to rise with Him.

"Encourage souls to place great trust in My fathomless mercy. Let the weak, sinful soul have no fear to approach Me, for even if it had more sins than there are grains of sand in the world, all would be drowned in the unmeasurable depths of My mercy."

Holy week tests our faith! Easily we flee with his disciples and betray Jesus, as did Judas and Peter. During our trials, perseverance flees and we fail. Failure ensnares us in the darkness for we do not follow the Light through darkness.

On the day of despair when our sin crucified our Lord, we are faced with the same questions as the disciples: Can we trust Jesus?

The beautiful truth is that through this struggle and trial, God rises and appears to us! All we need is to have open eyes and hearts to see and trust.

Trust rejoices for we pass through the darkness of death and find life. His life is our life and his resurrection is ours too.

Today we rejoice for we trusted, despite our doubts that the Lord rises from the dead. His resurrection liberates us from sin and allows us to walk in newness of life, for we are a new creation, singing:

"I will praise you, Lord, for you have rescued me."
God's visitation surprises us. He always surprises us bringing good out of evil.

The women come to the tomb only to be completely surprised that the stone was rolled away. John and Peter run to the tomb and are surprised that it is empty and the linens are folded. Then the great surprise. Jesus appears showing his wounds and his side, declaring:

"Peace be with You!"

Surprised, we experience the unbelievable. Sin loses its hold as Jesus forgives and breaks the chains that enslave. Death is destroyed because Jesus rises from the dead. Our lives are restored and our trust in Jesus is renewed.

No greater witness exists than when a person fulfills his promises. Jesus promised He would rise from the dead and He did. Jesus promised to send his Holy Spirit giving us courage and confidence and He did. Jesus gives us confidence for his words are true. In his resurrection, our doubt has been destroyed, for Jesus creates hope that despite our sinfulness and fears of death, we too will rise if we persevere.

"The nearer Christ comes to a heart, the Friendships more it becomes conscious of its guilt; it will then either ask for his mercy and find peace, or else it will turn against Him because it is not yet ready to give

"I call you friends" (John 15:14).

define. Thev give us our identity providing meaning and purpose. Our closest friendships lead, guide, direct, and give us protection and projection.

To find such a friend is a treasure. They are a sturdy shelter, for they have been tested and proven trustworunits sinfulness, thy. Hence, Scripture tells

"Let your acquaintances be many but one in a thousand your confident" (Sir 6:6).

Friendships today challenge us as many waver in their commitment. No longer is fidelity part of our morality for relativity causes divisions, dissensions, and divorce. Sadly, oaths and promises no longer have force for many change their minds which allows them to break their promises. Fidelity in friendship however is needed for we cannot trust someone who wavers.

Fidelity is still honored today. Jesus comes to prove his fidelity when others have broken theirs. He restores our friendships by becoming our friend. His friendship tests us to see if we will be loyal to Him. Despite our infidelity—sin—He accepts us. He comes not to condemn us for our infidelities but to strengthen our resolve to stay faithful, even in bad

To experience such friendship solidifies our faith. Many today lack experience of faithful friendship and so never truly understand Jesus' offer. They question and become cautious for nothing hurt's more than a faithless friend.

To prove his friendship, Jesus calls us friends and then gives his pledge to stay faithful, laying down his life upon the cross. Hence Jesus tells us:

'Greater love has not man than this, that a man lay down his life for his friends" (John 15:13).

This He does, even while we are enemies sinners— rebelling against Him.

What greater proof do we need to accept Jesus as our intimate friend, Who gives us divine life by influencing our lives through his perfect friendship.

The glory of God gives life to those who believe and receive the Holy Spirit. God. Who cannot be grasped, allows Himself to be seen and grasped by becoming human.

Jesus reveals God to us giving us a true friendship. More so, He gives us divine life for we see Him as He is.

It is impossible to live fully alive without God. We find life only when we fully participate in God's life.

In Jesus, we see the face



of God which truly is a reflection of our self We experience and enjoy not only the glory of God, but our own souls glorified in Christ.

Humanity experiences God when we are alive in His Spirit. Through this experience, we become immortal and attain oneness with God Himself, in other words, we are divinized, for He sends us the Spirit so we may abide in Him. Jesus spoke about his abiding presence in us at the Passover Meal:

"If you keep my commandments, you will abide in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and abide in his love" (Jn 15:10).

The abiding presence comes at Pentecost which inflames us with love. This love is our new life in Christ.

Through Jesus' death, resurrection, and coming of the Holy Spirit, the whole of creation experiences the Father's love through the Son. His Son not only creates all things, but loves all that He created, restoring creation filling it with his beauty, goodness, and truth. To participate in this goodness, John the Baptist tells us, (Matt 3:11).

"He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire."

His Spirit cannot be seen with eyes, yet He is certainly known through the eyes of faith which sees God's Spirit inflame hearts with pure love. This love abides within, giving us courage to live knowing we are redeemed. As his Holy Spirit removes our sins and fills us with divine life we have his power abiding within that casts out fears bringing hope when hope seemed lost.




