There is no evil to be faced that Christ does not face with us. There is no enemy that Christ has not already conquered. There is no cross to bear that Christ has not already borne for us and does not now bear with us. And on the far side of every cross we find the newness of life in the Holy Spirit, that new life which will reach its fulfillment in the resurrection. This is our faith. This is our witness before the world.

word Shalom. Shalom does not merely mean to be free of war or tension, but it harmonizes a person with God's will: Thy will be done!

Shalom is harmony with God knowing that what you are doing and facing is God's will — sometimes God's cross — for you.

Shalom strengthens us to carry this cross knowing our strength comes from the Lord, not ourselves!

Those who try to carry their cross on their own will struggle, fight, and fail because they rely on worldly resolutions, personal efforts, and sometimes evil solutions.

Those who face their crosses in life trust in Divine Mercy. Divine Mercy is God's love displayed. Mercy actively heals us! The mercy revealed last week with His death and resurrection, invites us to receive mercy through confession.

Confession, the sacrament that reconciles us with the Father, restores our dignity as it gives us courage to confess any and all sins. Sadly, our pride gets in the way of our relationship with Jesus and we fail to trust our shame to his mercy. We cannot fathom a God who forgives as well as heals, especially when we feel so unworthy. Yet, Jesus states:

'Abide in me, and I in you. As the branch cannot bear fruit by itself, unless it abides in the vine, neither can you, unless you abide in me. I am the vine, you are the branches. He who abides in me, and I in him, he it is that bears much fruit, for

apart from me you can do nothing." –John 15:4-5

Jesus desires to purify us! He desires to remove the darkness of sin from our lives! He desires that we bear fruit as He does, rising from the dead. To bear fruit He explains:

"Every branch that does bear fruit he prunes,

that it may bear more fruit." (John 15:2) This is what confession does. His Divine Mercy so unfathomable prunes us of sin, then restores our dignity revealing to us our infinite value as seen through the eyes of our Father. Do you believe this?

To confirm this over and over the Psalm reminds us: "His mercy endures forever." Ps 118

When devotions: prayer, Sunday Mass, keeping the commandments, and the Holy Days are considered an inconvenience to our schedule, nothing will ever penetrate our attitude – not even the crucifixion of a man.

Sundays have become Saturdays, just another day to enjoy the weekend and entertain ourselves with every sort of activity.

Sunday has become a day of distraction – not a day of engagement. It has become a day of business,

instead of being a day of prayer, peace, and family. Sadly even those who attend Mass are easily distracted. They have not prepared themselves properly to encounter God during Mass. Their worries and concerns are self-centered rather than God-centered. And worst of all the faithful complain that the Mass is boring, dull, and fruitless.

What you prepare for is what you get! Mass is not the problem. The priest is not the issue. The people, the music, the lector, the acolytes, the time, the place, the bad coffee or lack of donuts, or any other excuse is not the problem with Mass. The problem is faith.

Living faithless disengages us with religious and spiritual realities. So caught up in the material world and all its pleasures and powers, we cannot fathom God is a Person, Who showers down grace upon grace to reveal his care to change our lives.

However, when tragedy strikes, when life loses its balance, when evil intervenes and we have nowhere else to turn, then Mass, prayer, and faith in God are suddenly important. We have no where else to turn.

Look at the changes that took place after the terrorist act of 9-11. Churches were full. People were praying. What was incredibly important one moment became completely irrelevant.

God's mercy became real!

Today, as back then, we need real faith to encounter God with an attitude that trusts in his Son.

"I have swept away your offenses like a cloud, your sins like the morning mist. Return to me, for I have redeemed you." (Is 44:22)

God's Mercy reveals his inexhaustible power to remove sin. Yet, as we face our own sinfulness and we see the sinfulness of others, especially in the destitute, we doubt, even despair how could anything be done to remedy the sins of the whole world.

This was the belief of the two disciples leaving for Emmaus. This was the belief of the apostles as they abandoned Christ on the Cross. But when all seemed lost, it was all gain. Jesus rose from the dead, cleansing us of sin and giving us new life.

Wars, insurrections, martyrdom, poverty, violence, financial woes, and a host of other evils make us doubt mercy. Sin and its source: evil, are so prevalent today, it is daunting to fathom a gracious God could do anything. It appears He has forsaken us. Yet, when all seems lost, all is gained again. Yet the gain is not for life in this world but for the next. In this world, we experience evil. In the next, if we persevere, we experience the beauty of God's Truth, Jesus, changing evil into Goodness.

Confidence in God's mercy creates trust. Trust never surrenders because God's mercy is not a quality nor a characteristic. Mercy is the Divine Person Jesus Christ, Who proclaims Himself to be Mercy Himself and empowers us to change the face of the earth trusting in Him.
