Stewardship of Love

Love is stewardship. When we love someone, we nurture the relationship doing what is good and right, not counting the cost. We develop the relationship through sacrifices, embracing the person we love despite their faults. If our love is true, we do anything for the one we love — anything!

Jesus asks us, Do you love me? Betrayals in love arise easily because our love is not pure. As did Peter so do we, betray Jesus in various ways. Betrayal, however, should not lead to divorce; betrayal should lead to repentance, reconciliation, and restoration.

Repentance is a radical re-orientation of the heart in which we root out the cause of our betrayal: whatever that may be!

To become a faithful steward's of love, Jesus confronts our betrayals. He exposes our failures not to give us a guilty complex, but to heal the cause of our betrayal.

Guilt leads to repentance when we understand its reason: to correct and reconnect. Healed within, we have the strength to restore any broken relationship. We can and we will do it, not by our love, but by the love that dwells within!

We are witnesses, as is the Holy Spirit whom God has given to those who obey him."

Layers of Pain

For most, when we think of pain, we relate to bodily pain. And yes, it can be excruciating, a crucifixion.

Yet, other levels of pain exist. Talk to someone who is filled with fear, anxiety, doubt, and the like.

St. Thomas Aquinas, explaining our emotions, states we have 11 base emotions in two categories. The first is concupiscible and the second is irascible. Concupiscible emotions are perceived as desirable

with their opposite. The list of concupiscible are: Love/Hate

Desire/Aversion Pleasure (Joy)/Pain (Sorrow)

Irascible, meaning `in anger,' are those emotions that refer to more difficult and challenging ones:

Hope/Despair Fear/Daring

Anger (stands alone)

All other emotions are but fine shades of these primordial eleven as described.

Sadly, emotions are powerful and also painful. Worse, our culture gives primacy to emotions as principles for behavior. 'How does it make you feel' is the root, making emotions the basis for decision making.

We are taught to do the things that make us happy — emotionally. Many times what makes us happy for the moment actually leads to dysfunction and addiction. St. Thomas tells us Reason - the power of our intellect that rightly orders - should temper our emotions.

Reason, or our mind, is also a source of pain. The mind seeks goodness, justice, and truth, and when we see evils, injustices and betrayals by lies, it is a deeper level of pain.

We have heard of the injustices concerning human trafficking, slavery, political and even ecclesial cover-ups, and the horror of genocide. These cause excruciating mental pain, for we know we are strangled and suppressed, unable to justify and vindicate the truth.

Finally, we have spiritual pain. This is the deepest level of pain as seen in depression. A person's life becomes dark: Judas suffered this! So did Peter. Yet Judas despaired, Peter hoped. Judas thought he killed God, Peter believed in God. Today many despair thinking God is dead. This is spiritual pain, and sadly is much taught and believed today. What is the answer to this spiritual pain? Trusting Divine Love as stated in Psalm 23:

The LORD is my shepherd; there is nothing I lack. In green pastures he makes me lie down; to still waters he leads me; he restores my soul.

Marian Devotions

Why do Catholics Worship Mary? The simple answer is we don't. What then do we do? We call her blessed, just as Scripture tells us so (Lk 1:48):

"For he has looked upon his handmaid's lowliness; behold, from now on will all ages call me blessed. The Mighty One has done great things for me, "

and holy is his name." Many discussions have led to many misunderstandings concerning Marian Devotion. But if we are going to base our under-

standing on a literal understanding of Scripture, we must call Mary blessed. Scripture tells us to do so.

The reason we do is not because of what she did, but because of what God did for her. To comprehend what God did for her, we have to understand what God did as the beginning of creation.

The Father created us in his image. We are created to love and be loved. God reveals the depth of this Divine Love by calling us his very own children, for we image Him literally through our relationships.

Adam and Eve have a divine nature — not the Uncreated Divine Nature of the Trinity; but a created divine nature in which they were blessed, for the Lord did great things for them. He made them one with each other and Himself.

Yet, they broke the image. They tainted the relationship in its core. They rejected their divine nature, and so to restore that image and the oneness, God creates a New Adam and a New Eve.

Jesus is the new Adam. (Rom 5:12) If Jesus is the new Adam who then is the new Eve? Mary! Brant Pitre explains Mary as the New Eve writing:

As the new Eve, Mary is created without sin to be a living sign of the righteous life of the new creation that is ushered in by Jesus' life, death and resurrection from the dead. As Jesus himself says in the book of Revelation: 'Behold, I make all things new.' (Rev. 21:5)



Hurting people need healing; and yet, the hurting person blames others mostly God, for all the problems in their lives.

Peter was hurting. He denied his Friend three times. He was broken inside and out. Yet Peter caused his own suffering by choosing to deny Christ. So too with us.

We hurt ourselves by our own choices and hurt others always when we are hurting. Also, we hurt ourselves if we do not respond nobly to people who hurt us. It is easy for us to become a victim and

then victimize others, and the cycle of hurt continues generation after generation.

Who will break the cycle?

Jesus asks us if we love Him more than our hurt or pain. If we do love Him, it will be seen in the way we respond to our pain.

Instead of feeding our hurt and pain with dysfunctional choices: alcohol, drugs, lust, gambling, social media, apathy, avarice, anger, envy, and arrogance, etc. Jesus asks us to seek forgiveness from Him and the power to forgive others. In so doing, so we forgive and are forgiven.

This is the secret to pain. Instead of wallowing in our pain and hurt, we seek healing from Jesus just as Peter did, crying out: **O LORD, be my helper. Change my mourning into dancing.** No better model exists to change hurt into joy than Mary. She at the foot of the cross, interceded for us during our cross, revealing the power of intercessory prayer. So we ask her to help us imitate her virtues:
